The Brazilian Olympic Committee (BOC) is proud to present the Team Brazil Guide for Beijing 2022! Through this write up, it will be possible to know a little more about the athletes of the Brazilian delegation in the next Winter Olympic Games, as well as have access to the COMPETITION SCHEDULE, historical data and curiosities about the Brazilian participation in the event.

Our delegation in China will have 11 athletes, in five sports: Bobsleigh, Alpine Skiing, Cross-Country Skiing, Freestyle Skiing and Skeleton. To make this possible, the investments made by BOC in winter sports, together with the Brazilian Sport on Ice Confederation (CBDG) and the Brazilian Sport on snow Confederation (CBDN) have been decisive in enabling the training stages and the participation of our athletes in the main competitions on the international calendar.

Brazilian athletes show constant development in every edition of the event, since the first participation, in Albertville 1992. Athletes from all over Brazil have had increasingly relevant performances in the various competitions due to structure and organization. This time we will have four regions of the country represented in the delegation!

Brazilian sport is going through a phase of great achievements in the most important international multisport competitions. I have no doubt that we are looking to overcome the participation in the previous edition.

Beijing 2022 is another great opportunity for BOC to reinforce its commitment on developing the values of the Olympic Movement, be it in summer or winter sports.

ANDERS PETTERSSON

Graduated in Economics and Business Administration in the Stockholm School of Economics, with several specialization courses in Brazil and abroad. He has served as CEO and Director in several companies, with a consolidated executive career.

Anders, son of Swedes brought up in Brazil, learned to ski during the period he studied and lived in Sweden, which made him familiar with snow sports. He started practicing cross-country skiing more than 20 years ago, being Brazilian runner-up in skiathlon and Brazilian masters champion in sprint.

After some time, he migrated to sports management, taking over the administration of sports in the Brazilian

Confederation of Sports in the Snow (CBDN). He led the Brazilian Nordic ski team in nine world championships (Obertsdorf 2005, Sapporo 2007, Liberec 2009, Oslo 2011, Val di Fiemme 2013, Falun 2015, Lahti 2017, Seefeld 2019, Obertsdorf 2021).

He was elected vice president of CBDN in 2010 and president eight years later. Since 2020, he has been a member of the Board of Directors of the Olympic Committee of Brazil (BOC) and was elected to the Board of the International Ski Mountain Federation (ISMF) based in Lausanne, Switzerland. He was head of the cross-country team at the Turin 2006 Olympic Games, and team manager of the snow sports at the Lausanne 2020 Winter Youth Olympic Games.

Daughter of a Brazilian mother and an American father, she made her debut representing the country conquering the 9th place at the Idre Fjall Open, in Sweden, in November, with a daring goal in Pequim: to be among the 16 best in the world.

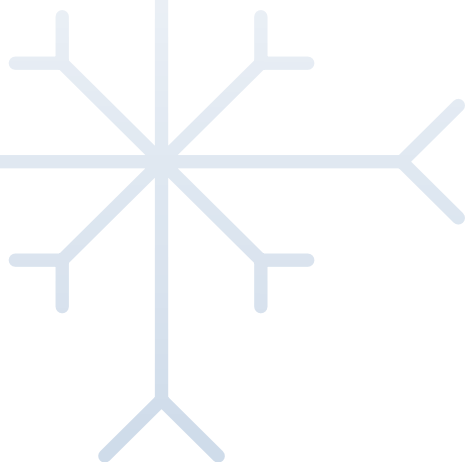

NOTE

After an excellent 8th place in the Skeleton test event in Yanqing, the Brazilian secured her spot in Beijing by getting 8 podiums in 17 days, including 5 golds in 5 stages of the Copa América in November. The 27-year-old athlete, who is also a nurse, has lived in Canada since childhood and has played 8 other sports – bobsleigh, crossfit, bodybuilding, football, artistic gymnastics, weightlifting, rugby and volleyball – before skeleton.

03 CURIOSITIES

- *Beijing 2022 will be the ninth Brazilian participation in the Winter Games, starting in Albertville 92.*
- *The country's record, both in number of athletes and in sports, was in Sochi 2014, with 13 athletes in seven sports.*
- *The best Brazilian placement in history came in Turin 2006 with Isabel Clark's 9th place in the snowboard cross. On the ice, the best position is the 19th place of Fabiana dos Santos and Sally da Silva in the 2-woman bobsleigh events in Sochi 2014.*
- *Brazil has been represented in 8 sports so far in the Winter Games: Biathlon, Bobsleigh, Alpine Skiing, Cross-Country Skiing, Freestyle Skiing, Luge, Figure Skating and Snowboarding.*
- *This means that there will be a debut at Beijing 2022: skeleton will feature a Brazilian athlete, Nicole Silveira, for the first time.*
- *But even in sports in which Brazil already had representatives, there will also be debuts. The moguls, on freestyle skiing, and sprint events by teams in cross-country skiing will be disputed by Brazilians for the first time.*
- *In all, Brazil was represented by 35 different athletes at the Winter Olympic Games, 25 men and 10 women.*
- *Jaqueline Mourão is the record holder for Olympic participation for Brazil among all athletes, summer and winter, with eight: Athens 2004, Turin 2006, Beijing 2008, Vancouver 2010, Sochi 2014, PyeongChang 2018, Tokyo 2020 and Beijing 2022.*
- *In Winter Games, Jaqueline also has the record for participation, with five participations, alongside Edson Bindilatti.*
- *Another record for Jaqueline is as a flag bearer. She went twice, Closing in Vancouver and Opening in Sochi. Hans Eger, Christian Lothar Munder, Marcelo Apovian, Isabel Clark and Isadora Williams also carried the flag twice.*
- *It is the first time in history that a city has hosted both the Summer and Winter Olympic Games. And Brazil will have a representative who was in both editions: Jefferson Sabino, being the first competing for athletics triple jump and, now, in Bobsleigh; and Jaqueline Mourão, in MTB cycling in 2008 and in 2022 in cross-country skiing.*
- *With that, Jeffão, as he likes to be called, joins the select group of 128 athletes from all over the world who have competed in both versions of the Olympic Games until this edition. He is only fourth in Brazil, joining Jaqueline Mourão, Claudinei Quirino and Mateus Inocêncio.*
- *Two athletes participated in the Youth Olympic Games: Michel Macedo, in Lillehammer 2016, and Manex Silva, in Lausanne 2020.*
- *Three athletes participated in the Youth Olympic Games: Michel Macedo, in Lillehammer 2016, and Manex Silva and Eduarda Ribera, in Lausanne 2020. Brazil will have four regions represented at Beijing 2022: Northeast, North, Southeast and South. Manex Silva was born in Rio Branco, Acre; Michel Macedo, Fortaleza, Ceará; Edson Bindilatti Camamu Bahia, Nicole Silveira, in Rio Grande, Rio Grande do Sul; and another 6 athletes in cities in the Southeast Region.*
- *Only one was not born in Brazil: Sabrina Cass, in New Haven (USA)*
